# Sermon preached by The Rev. Charles Rowins at St. Christopher-by-the-Sea, Lent 5, March 17, 2024.

All of us, I suspect, have favorite Biblical passages. One of mine is in this morning's Psalm. "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me."

Why is this a favorite? Because 1) it recognizes that I have some things to work on, and 2) a correction is well within my power. Not a full-scale make-over. Rather a tweak here and there. An adjustment that I can make <u>if</u> I choose to do so.

So, what's stopping me? Why is it still an issue? I know I can do better. So I pray to the Lord. "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me."

#### Sound familiar?

Key word here is "renew." A "right spirit" is not a new experience, but sometimes the "right spirit" drifts away. We don't even recognize it. And that's when a correction is in order. So, assuming I am even aware, I go to the well one more time and ask God for a little help.

My guess is that this sentiment is not new to you. You might use a different prayer, but the element of renewal is common. Back to basics, if you will. A tweak here and there. Enough to get me, and maybe you, back on track.

This conversation with God is probably not something we share with others, even those closest to us. We hope that we can make whatever correction is necessary without going public. "Create in me." "Renew in me." This is between me and you, Lord. No one else. Please.

The irony here is that, if indeed we make a correction, if renewal does take place, those closest to us will recognize it. "What's gotten into you? You're cheery today. What's up?" To which we probably say, "Oh, it's nothing. Not to worry."

But, it <u>is</u> something, isn't it? A conversation with the Creator of the Universe? A one-to-one visit with God Almighty? Wow!

Such is the nature of prayer. Little old you and me having a chat with the Creator of the Universe.

Is that even possible? Well, you and I think so. We believe so. We have our doubts, but we continue to come down on the side of "Our Father, who art in heaven ...."

And, we're not the only ones. Belief in a Creator, a God, a Power responsible for all that is and will be, is universal. This common denominator alone ought to confirm what we do in this setting.

In every religion, there is a version of "Create in me a clean heart, O God." Whatever our religious background, we want to do better in all sorts of ways. The Christian Faith is one of the options for "doing better."

Clearly there are other options. And we respect those options. But one doesn't pray to an option. One prays to a Creator. And, in our case, one prays to a Creator who is also a Savior. The Creator who takes on our humanity.

Can you imagine a Creator who doesn't do this? Probably not. We are used to the notion, the possibility, that the Creator of the Universe does indeed take on our humanity. For you and me in this setting, the concept of Incarnation, of God appearing in human flesh, is not a stumbling block, but a confirmation of God as loving and forgiving and understanding.

And so, every now and then, especially when we recognize that we can do better, we fall on our knees and pray "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me."

A bit later in today's Psalm is this verse: "Give me the joy of your saving help again, and sustain me with your bountiful spirit." Confession is tough to do, but absolution is worth it, isn't it. God couldn't be happier than to greet us, listen to us, and assure us that His Love is for real. What a good feeling that assurance is when you and I are down on ourselves.

"Get up" God says. "Go on your way. There is work to do. You've shared your heart. Now I'll share mine. Remember Jesus? He died for you. But he also rose for you. I died for you. But I also rose for you. My choice. My decision.

A mystery? God continues: "For you, yes. For me, routine. And don't be shy about coming back at any time for anything. That's what I'm here for."

"And don't forget this. What <u>you</u>'re here for is to live a life of service. And when you falter at this task, don't hesitate to seek my help. I actually love to hear these words: 'Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.' Not because of what you might have done unfaithfully, but because you recognize where to go for help, for assurance, for yet another chance at being your best."

It's as if God himself composed our final hymn today:

Guide me, O thou great Jehovah, pilgrim through this barren land; I am weak, but thou art mighty: hold me with thy powerful hand; bread of heaven, bread of heaven, feed me now and ever more, feed me now and ever more."

And so we gather at the Lord's table, and we share in God's favorite dish: "a clean heart and a right spirit."

And, if we're looking for a grace to offer over this special meal, St Patrick, who is remembered on this day, suggests this one:

Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ will win me, Christ to comfort and restore me.

Amen.

Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *Amen*.

Very truly I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single gain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honor. Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say – 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.
