Easter 4 sermon – April 21, 2024

Gibson Island has many beautiful and intriguing structures. As far as I know, no house is the same as another housel. And no plot of land is the same, as far as I can tell from driving around the Island. But your homes are not the only structures that are intriguing. Indeed, one of the most intriguing structures in this community is the one in which we are right now. This chapel.

As we recognize the 100th anniversary of St. Christopher's, we are discovering lots of photos, drawings, and paintings of this special place. There is something that draws the eye to this property, and it's not just the physical elements like the roof or the bell or the deck or the altar. There is something more going on. It's the people. It is you. It is the string of baptisms, marriages and burials, as well as the weekly services and special services, such as Blessing of the Animals.

When you see a painting or photo of this place, the first thing that comes to your mind is not what kind of shingles were used in the construction. No, the first thing that comes to mind are the people who observed special occasions on this property. That would be most if not all of you, plus those who simply drive by or walk by. One's attention is drawn to these structures, and in turn to remembrances of events, neighbors, family members, visitors.

If you were to ask a visitor "What do you remember when you first visited friends or family on Gibson Island?" the visitor might well cite the chapel, with its parish hall and deck and, yes, the Memorial Garden. And the view from the back of the chapel. Like the front of the chapel, the view from the back never gets old. It's one of the draws of this Island community.

We are not a cathedral structure-wise. But we are a cathedral spirit-wise. The word "cathedral" refers to the "seat, the location, of the bishop." Clearly, we here are not a cathedral in this sense. But we are a home to a spirit-filled community. This is our "seat." This where we gather for spirit-filled events. These events include the Sunday service, other services throughout the year, baptisms, marriages, burials, confessions, absolutions, fresh starts, prayers of all sorts, and many, many silent moments.

It's a special place in other words. Not just the architecture, not just the property, not just the view, not just special events. It's all of these things, which in their own way remind us of a loving God, who appeared as a first century carpenter and as an ever-present forgiving and challenging Sprit. It is where we gather to say thank you, to ask for forgiveness, and to accept forgiveness, to face challenges, make promises, remind self and others of the availability of God's love, especially in the toughest of situations.

St. Christopher's is adjacent to the golf course. It's not <u>un</u>common for golf balls to appear in the parking lot or elsewhere on the grounds. Sometimes we keep them as souvenirs, but most of the time we toss them back to where they belong and where someone had hoped they would land.

If I were a golf ball and was flying toward the first hole, and then caught sight of this beautiful little chapel, I would be tempted to make a sharp right hand turn, either in the air or on the ground, and end up in the parking lot, maybe as far as the Memorial Garden. It happens!

When one visits the Island for the first time and makes his or her way to the office, he or she will pass he church and catch a glimpse. And the visitor will be struck by the simple beauty of this place. And perhaps the person will make another visit and spend some time here. Either at a Sunday service, or during the week when they are on the property. And the peace they find in the open building is not an accident. And what they discover is that the peace of the chapel is reflected in the whole property.

This phenomenon, this draw, is a symbol of the draw of Jesus. He is a really interesting, even compelling figure. And the more we get to know him, either in private prayer or Sunday service or study group or social event, the more we want to know.

Now, not everyone who is intrigued by Jesus, will follow him. Indeed there are times when it appears that Jesus doesn't listen. Why didn't you, Lord, intervene when I needed you? Why did you allow this to happen? I've been faithful to you, and this is what I get? Massive disappointment? Give me a break, Lord.

Sound familiar? Sure it does. But the disappointment doesn't last, does it. Thanks to a forgiving and loving God, we are welcomed back to a positive relationship with the Lord. We know where we belong, and we know where we will find strength in the short run and genuine happiness over the long haul.

And here we are. Thank you, Lord. Amen.
