Sermon preached by The Rev. Charles Rowins at St. Christopher-by-the-Sea, Gibson Island, Maryland. Third Sunday of Lent. March 3, 2024.

Here's a question for you. Can you imagine what life would be like without the 10 Commandments?

It would be a mess, wouldn't it? A free-for-all. We have enough trouble with the Commandments, never mind without them.

And, can you imagine any number of Commandments that someone other than God might establish? That would be a mess too. Commandment-establishers would be competing with one another. The physically strongest might prevail and be the author of record. Or the mentally strongest might prevail and be the author of record.

Either outcome would be devastating. We are challenged living with the Commandments. <u>Imagine the challenge</u> living without them. No thank you!

Yes, we'll take the Commandments that God established <u>and</u> communicated to the Creation through Moses and generations of other God-appointed servants. **(Exodus 20:1-17)** A smart decision on God's part to set boundaries. And a smart decision on our part to respect those boundaries.

Notice that, in setting boundaries, God did not establish a police force. Pretty brave on God's part. Although I suspect that God wonders at times whether this was His best decision. After all, there is a risk in "free will."

But, of course, it was a good decision, maybe the best decision. The alternative is chaos. Everybody for himself or herself. And, because it is the best decision, we ought to respect it and promote it.

And we do, don't we? We try to honor the Commandments, and we try to honor especially the Author of the Commandments. And, in this setting, we honor the Author who <u>becomes one of us</u> in order to make up the ground between expectation on God's part and reality on our part.

It's called <u>Forgiveness</u>. Not just forgiveness from anyone, but capital F Forgiveness from the One in Charge of the Whole Enterprise. God could cast us out, but chooses to invite us to stay. Saint Paul, in his letter to the Corinthians, notes that this decision on Gods' part is viewed by some as "foolishness." But not you and me. "To us who are being saved it is the power of God." **(I Corinthians 1:18)**

Is this level of love too much to believe, too much to count on? Are we being naïve, thinking that Almighty God would put up with our disobedience? Certainly God could withhold His Love if He wanted to. He could even make a "whip of cords" and drive us out of the Temple. **(John 2:15)**

But apparently that's not what God wants. Rather, God gives you and me yet another opportunity to accept His Love and express that Love in **our lives**. Our love for God will never be as impressive as God's Love for us. But God doesn't expect perfection. What God expects from us is thanksgiving and fresh starts and better performance.

Today's Psalm includes the phrase "the statutes of the Lord are just and rejoice the heart." **(Psalm 19:8)** "Rejoice the heart." That's how we feel, isn't it. God gives us another chance to do His will. Of yes, we might well squander this new chance, as we have done before. But, God has promised to stick by us. And here we are.

Not with records of perfection. But with hearts of thanksgiving. Forgiveness is beautiful and powerful. And if we accept God's forgiveness, we will make life better not only for ourselves. We'll do so for others. Perfection will still be a ways off. But we'll be on the right track, to everyone's benefit.

And, if and when we wander off track, the Risen Christ will by our side, helping us right the ship one more time. The hymn we just sang includes the phrase "bid mercy triumph over wrath." And that's exactly what you and believe in this setting. Life is full of darkness. It's the price of freedom. But life is also full of Light. Not little "I" light, but capital "L" Light. Good is stronger than evil. Hope is stronger than fear.

God reigns, and invites us, in and through the life, death and resurrection of a first century carpenter, to join God in caring for the Creation. What a privilege. God must think we are worth saving. And for that confidence in us, we are deeply thankful.

And the way we show our thanks is to run interference for the Lord. We are his representatives in a world in need of help. Buckle up! We have work to do.

Or better yet, we have more work to do. We're starting a second century of service in God's Name. It's not the only service we provide. You all are sharing the Love in what you do every day in all sorts of settings. But it is pretty special, isn't it, to gather regularly to share our disciple experiences in this lovely chapel.

Here's to another century of fellow<u>ship</u> and disciple<u>ship</u> and steward<u>ship</u>. Three really special "ships." How appropriate for this special water-centered community. I have to think that God is really well pleased with what this worshipping community <u>has</u> contributed and <u>is</u> contributing to the welfare of God's creation.

Our concluding hymn today will be the Naval Hymn **(#608)**, which includes this final phrase: "thus ever more shall rise to thee glad hymns of praise from land and sea." There have been a lot of "glad hymns of praise" from this congregation over its first century of service. With more to come.

Nice work, everybody. And, lest we forget Thank you God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *Amen*.

Lessons for Lent 3 – March 3, 2024

First Reading: Exodus 20:1-17

God spoke all these words to Moses on Mount Sinai: "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, punishing children for the iniquity of parents, to the third and the fourth generation of those who reject me, but showing steadfast love to the thousandth generation of those who love me and keep my commandments. You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the Lord your God, for the Lord will not acquit anyone who misuses his name. Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work – you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your live stock, or the alien resident in your towns. For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the Lord blessed the sabbath day and consecrated it. Honor your father and your mother so that your days may be so long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you. You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or male or female slave, or ox, or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor."

Psalm 19

The heavens declare the glory of God, and the firmament shows his handiwork. One day tells its tale to another, and one night imparts knowledge to another. Although they have no words or language, and their voices are not heard, Their sound has gone out into all lands, and their message to the ends of the world; In the deep has he set a pavilion for the sun; it comes forth like a bridegroom out of his chamber; it rejoices like a champion to run its course. It goes forth from the uttermost edges of the heavens and runs about to the end of it again; nothing is hidden from its burning heat. The law of the Lord is perfect and revives the soul; the testimony of the Lord is sure and gives wisdom to the innocent. The statutes of the Lord are just and rejoice the heart; the commandment of the Lord is clear and gives light to the eves. The fear of the Lord is clean and endures of ever; the judgments of the Lord are true and righteous altogether. More to be desired are they than gold, more than much fine gold, sweeter far than honey, than honey in the comb. By them also is your servant enlightened, and in keeping them there is great reward. Who can tell how often he offends? cleanse me from my secret faults. Above all, keep your servant from presumptuous sins; let them not get dominion over me; then shall I be whole and sound, and innocent of a great offense. Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight,

O lord, my strength and my redeemer.

Second Reading: I Corinthians 1:18-25

The message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart." Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. For Jews demands signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.
