Sermon for Trinity Sunday preached by The Rev. Charles Rowins at St. Christopher-by-the-Sea, Gibson Island, Maryland, June 4, 2023.

Trinity Sunday. Three in One Sunday. God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit Sunday. Hymn 362 Sunday – Holy, holy, holy.

So many entry points for today's sermon. Where to start? Perhaps one of the seven days.

Day 1 - day and night

Day 2 - land, water and sky

Day 3 - vegetation

Day 4 - sun and moon

Day 5 - sea and air

Day 6 - male and female

Day 7 - take a break

If you were preaching today, where would you start? What would be your entry point? Would it be the whole week, or just one of the seven days, and, if just one, which one?

Or, if you were God, might you have an entirely different approach than just Day 1 or just Day 7?

It's all a moot point, isn't it? We are not God. We are not the Creator. If we can believe Scripture, what we are is a helper. Someone to assist in caring for the Creation. A very special helper, to be sure, but a helper nonetheless. Not the Creator. A helper.

So, let's ask the question again. If we are a helper, whom or what are we supposed to help?

I think it is safe to say that we are supposed to help those who need help. But there's more to the answer, isn't there? And that is that we are supposed to help those whom we can help.

And the key here is not to underestimate our ability to make a positive difference in the life of others. We might not have medical training, but we can help heal. We might not be physically strong, but we can make tough decisions.

For every help that we cannot provide, there is help that we can provide. Sometimes the greatest help is a quiet presence in the midst of fear or uncertainty.

Yes, a calmness. An attitude that takes things down a notch. A step back for the purpose of considering next steps. From the abyss, in other words.

And, what day of the week might that be? Sunday. Day 7. A day of rest, not from responsibility, but from frenzy. A day of consideration in terms of what comes next and just how we might fit into that picture.

Can you even imagine a week without Sunday? Can you imagine non-stop action that saps energy and creativity and insight? That kind of 24-7 engagement is what characterizes much of our lives. Can we imagine it? Of course, we can. Often we're a part of it. And, when we are a part of the frenzy, we add to the frenzy, and further complicate a situation that needs some rest.

With some irony, today's Gospel suggests that there is important work to do. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, including baptizing and teaching."

Is the message here "Stay busy"? Or, is the message perhaps "If you must be busy, at least take me with you." It's the latter, isn't it?

If we were in God's presence, we would be busy-beavers, wouldn't we? But we would also take a break from time to time. We would need to refuel. We would need to re-energize.

Jesus himself took breaks. Jesus did what you and I are doing right now. We know we need energy. And we know where to find that energy. With one another, at table, with the Lord. And, what was the Lord's message at that table? "Live in peace."

Not "stop working." But "live in peace." A version perhaps of "whistle while you work."

Whatever our training, whatever our desires, whatever our particular contribution might be to "living in peace," we should remember that this attitude, this approach to life, this application of whatever gifts or talents we have been given or developed, is what we are meant to show forth. We are meant to model hope and joy and thanksgiving. We are intended to be beacons of light. We have a purpose, not self-invented, but implanted by God.

We are special, special creatures, created in the image of God.

That identity alone ought to motivate us to be the best people that we can be. The best parents, the best children, the best neighbors, the best citizens, the best examples of using our particular gifts and talents.

We don't want to duplicate effort. We want to add effort. We have something worthwhile to contribute. Something that no one else can contribute. Why? Because it comes from us.

<u>We are</u> for a reason. Jesus was born, lived, died, and rose from the dead, for a reason. And that reason was simply to help us contribute to the welfare of the world in manner commensurate with <u>our</u> gifts and talents. And each of us has those gifts and talents. No excuses. Share them.

So, pick your day - Sunday through Saturday, Day 1 through Day 7 – and then review your special gifts. And <u>then</u> deliver them in ways that bring joy and help to others. That possibility, that combination, that opportunity exists. Not always easy to recognize, apply, and share. But well worth the journey, for self and others. Yes, let's keep the Creation moving in a positive direction, just as God intended.

It's a new Day, after all.

First Reading: Genesis 1:1-2:4a

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the **first day**.

And God said, "Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters." So God made the dome and separated the waters that were under the dome from the waters that were above the home. And it was so. God called the dome Sky. And there was evening and there was morning, the **second day**.

And God said, "Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear." And it was so. God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good. Then God said, "Let the earth put forth vegetation: plants yielding seed, and fruit trees of very kind on earth that bear fruit with the seed in it." And it was so. The earth brought forth vegetation: Plants yielding seed of every kind and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the **third day**.

And God said, "Let there be light in the dome of the sky to separate the day from the night; and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years, and let them be lights in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth." And it was so. God made the two great lights – the greater light to rule the day and the

lesser light to rule the night- and the stars. God set them in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth, to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the **fourth day**.

And God said, "Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the dome of the sky." So God created the great sea monsters and every living creature that moves, of every kind, with which the waters swarm and every winged bird of every kind. And God saw that it was good. God blessed them, saying "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth." And there was evening and there was morning, the **fifth day**.

And God said, "Let the earth being forth living creatures of every kind: cattle and creeping things and wild animals of the earth of every kind." And it was so. God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind, and the cattle of every kind, and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good. Then God said, "Let us make human-kind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth." So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. God blessed them and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it: and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth." God said, "See, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit; you shall have them for food. And to every beast of the earth, and to every bird of the air, and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has breath of life I have given every green plant for food." And it was so. God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good. There was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all their multitude. And on the **seventh day** God finished the work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from the all the work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all the work that he had done

in creation. These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created.
